Epicentro	The initiative emerges to secure the appropriate use of public resources destined to the reconstruction of areas affected by the three earthquakes originated in Chiapas (September 8th, 2017), Puebla and Morelos (September 19th, 2017), which also affected Mexico City, Guerrero, Tabasco, Oaxaca and Estado de México. This plural civil organization group has begun to impulse the creation of a web of knowledge that serves to identify, monitor and make proposals to guarantee the public benefit of resources and avoid corruption, impunity, or the political use of the situation.

Nosotrxs acts within the legal framework in defense cases of abuse, negligence or corruption. It also plans a follow up on legal issues: real estate, state support, workers who were abused and forced to get back to their work places, gender issues, etc. For this purpose, Observatorio considers the direct dialogue with affected communities and intends to provide workshops and artistic and cultural activities to create trust and be able to recover the memories of each site in order to activate aid strategies.

They found indigenous groups cooperatives, so reconstruction efforts are done inclusively and the plans for rebuilding homes and communities are participatory. AMBULANTE	The cinematography organization launched a campaign as an authorized fund raiser, and after September 19 has become a second floor organization to gain and direct resources. ILSB	ILSB is working on incidence during reconstruction, they teamed with Ciudad Feminista. ALTERNATIVAS Y CAPACIDADES	Through their website Fondos a la Vista, they are mapping a data base of more than 30 thousand organizations that mobilize financial and non financial resources and who will operate them. They established minimum standards to differentiate organizations that use resources adequately. They are not experts on spending donations, but can manage transparency guidelines.
